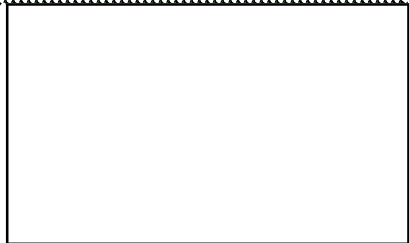

## Chester Carlson

February 8 (1906) - happy birthday to the inventor of Xerography, Chester Floyd Carlson!

Bio: born in Seattle, Washington; like Thomas Edison, he had to go to work at an early age (8) to support the family; by the time he was in high school he was the principal provider; his mother died of t.b. when he was 17; his father died when Chester was 27. He had a fascination with graphic arts and one of the first things he wanted in grammar school was a typewriter. He graduated from Caltech with a B.S. degree in Physics in 1930, near the start of the Great Depression. He wrote letters seeking employment to 82 companies; none offered him a job. As a last resort he took a job as a research engineer for Bell Telephone Labs in NYC. Fired from that job in '33 for participating in a failed "business scheme," outside of the Labs with several other employees, he went to work for Austin & Dix; a year later he went to work for P. R. Mallory (now known as the Duracell division of Procter & Gamble) and was promoted to head of the patent department.

In '36 he began studying law at night at NY Law School, receiving his LL.B degree in '39. He studied at the NY Public Library, copying longhand from law books because he couldn't afford to buy them. The pains induced by this laborious copying hardened his resolve to find a way to build a true copying machine. Having learned about the value of patents in his early career as a patent clerk and attorney, Carlson patented his developments every step along the way; his first preliminary patent application was filed in '37.

Electrophotography had a breakthrough in '38 when Kornei wrote the words "10.-22.-38 ASTORIA" in India ink on a glass microscope slide. The road to success had long been filled with failure but on October 6, 1942, the Patent Office issued Carlson's patent on electrophotography. Finally Battelle Memorial Institute in Columbus, Ohio took a risk on Carlson's invention and agreed to act as Carlson's agent for his patents, etc. When John Dessauer, chief of research at the Haloid Company read an article on Carlson's invention, a partnership was born to license electrophotography for a commercial product. In '48 Joe Wilson, Haloid's CEO, convinced the U.S. Army Signal Corps to invest \$100,000. In '47 Carlson accepted an offer to become a consultant to Haloid; he and his wife Dorris moved to Rochester, NY to be near the company's base of operations. In a letter to Joe Wilson in 1953, Carlson wrote: "What Bell is to the telephone, or more aptly, what Eastman is to photography, Haloid could be to xerography!"

The Xerox 914 success changed Haloid to Xerox and the culmination of Carlson's life work and he began pursuing his philanthropic interests. In '68 while vacationing in the Bahamas, Carlson died of a heart attack; Xerox arranged a large service in the corporate auditorium in Rochester. Carlson is memorialized by buildings at the two largest institutions of higher learning in Rochester: The Chester F. Carlson Center for Imaging Science, a department of RIT, and The University of Rochester's Carlson Science & Engineering Library.

"Thank you Chester" for keeping your dream alive all those years in the face of rejection and despair. You were the epitome of a great man who would not take NO for an answer. Your dream come true was an opportunity for each of us to work for a company we respected and admired. Today we honor you and your brilliance!!

## Talk About Investments To Help Avoid Fraud

(NAPSI) Older people are regularly targeted by fraud criminals because they have money—whether it’s retirement savings, home equity or steady forms of income. Experienced investors may also believe they’re too smart to be scammed. Research funded by the FINRA Investor Education Foundation shows, surprisingly, that financially savvy, self-reliant investors are more likely to be victims of fraud than those who are less knowledgeable.

“Investors who are overconfident about their ability to spot a ‘great opportunity’ are less likely to ask for help and advice from others,” said Gerri Walsh of the FINRA Foundation. “And that’s exactly what fraud criminals want.”

“Trick\$ of the Trade: Outsmarting Investment Fraud,” a documentary produced by the Foundation and airing on public television stations, explains these tactics and the steps that investors can take to protect themselves. Free copies of the movie can be ordered on the Foundation’s fraud-fighting website, [www.SaveAndInvest.org](http://www.SaveAndInvest.org). The website also offers information on how to check the background of a financial professional and the legitimacy of securities.

It is a discussion Robert Kalinowski, a 25-year veteran of the Vermont State Police, wishes he had had with his father.

The older Kalinowski was befriended by a financial advisor. The two would go to high school sporting events together—but the friendship was a ruse to steal \$100,000 in an investment scheme.

“I did not see this happening,” Kalinowski said. “I felt rotten. I was supposed to protect everybody...but I did not see this coming.”

Checking the advisor’s registration to sell securities would have revealed that he was no longer licensed. The advisor was eventually charged with embezzlement and grand larceny, but died before the trial.

“No matter what, it can happen to anybody,” Kalinowski said. “They have to check before they invest their money, ask questions, ask the experts, do research. If it could happen to our family, it could happen to you.”

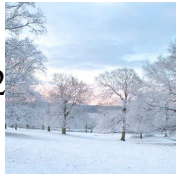

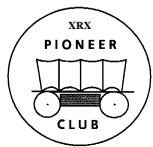
